Senior Constable Simon Lockwood of Parkes PCYC, Youth Command has proposed his intention to run the PCYC bus from Eugowra – Parkes PCYC once weekly (twice if demand warrants) to allow children to attend Vacation Care on prearranged days during the summer school holidays.

The Vacation Care program run through the PCYC is a recognized program and meets the requirements of the Department of Education and Communities, and also meets the Education and Care Services National Regulations. The program follows the National Quality Standards and National Quality Framework. In short it is a program which involves sporting/art/educational/excursions components with supervision of the children through the day.

The day normally runs from 0830 till 5.30pm. If demand warrants it is Senior Constable Lockwood's intention to utilize the PCYC bus and pick up children from Eugowra at 0800 and return them to Eugowra at 5.30pm. The cost of the bus is free however the Vacation care costs \$33 per child, rebates are available by way of the Child Care Benefit and Child Care Rebate to children/parents meeting the criteria.

The Parkes PCYC runs the program daily and is available to any child (Kindergarten to Year 6). Naturally if anyone wants their children to attend more regularly during the vacation their own arrangements re attendance would need to be organized.

Parkes PCYC is happy for the attendance of children from Eugowra and Senior Constable Lockwood suggested it as he was aware that there are limited child care opportunities within Eugowra. Vacation care runs from January 13th to the commencement of the school year in 2014.

The bus seats 15 so spots would be limited to that. The exact dates that he would offer this service would be finalized closer to the end of the school term and upon some idea of the expected attendance. Prior to attendance the PCYC would require the appropriate approvals filled out and signed by parents. Again these will be forwarded to interested parties later in the school term.

Please let the school know if you would be interested in this for your children as we need to make arrangements prior to the end of the term.

ATAPS - Child Mental Wellbeing Service



The ATAPS - Child Mental Wellbeing Service provides children under the age of 12 with access to evidence based short term psychological strategies. This service is aimed towards children who have or are at risk of developing mental, emotional or behavioural disorders. The child does not have to have a formal diagnosis. The Child Mental Wellbeing Service also works with the family and/or caregivers to assist them in providing better support to the child.

Who can access the Service?

Children under the age of 12, who are not accessing mental health services through state-funded health services (e.g. Community Mental Health or CAMHS) are eligible for the service.

Cost:

The Child Mental Wellbeing Service is a short-term program (up to 12 sessions per calendar year) and children requiring longer psychological interventions are not suited to the program and will be directed to the most appropriate alternate service. Parents/caregivers may also be invited to participate in the sessions however the child is the main focus of the support.

The service is funded by The Government at no charge to the client.

What strategies will be used by the psychologists?

The psychologists will tailor services to meet the needs of the child and some of the services might include behavioural interventions, parenting and family-based interventions, and cognitive behavioural therapy.

How to access the Service:

Currently a GP is the only one who can refer you to this service. A GP Mental Health Treatment Plan or Child Treatment Plan must be completed.
